Safety Center's 14th Annual Symposium

All New Supervisors' Track

This year's Symposium features a specially developed supervisor track called "Supervisors' Safety Shorts." We listened to suggestions and feedback from supervisors asking for short classes addressing "hot topics" in the industry. To address that need, Safety Center Incorporated developed a "round robin" that will be presented in the afternoon. It will consist of six, one-half hour sessions. Each supervisor will have the opportunity to pick any four subject sessions to attend. This year's Safety Shorts are:

Fall Protection

When is fall protection needed? How do you properly fit and wear a harness? Does a harness have to be inspected each time you use it? These are some of the questions that will be answered in the "Fall Protection Awareness session."

Proper Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

Another informative half-hour session will be Proper PPE....Respirators. Here you will learn about respirator selection and the typical applications including filtering face piece respirators. You will also learn about elastomeric face piece respirators, and powered and supplied air respirators.

Lockout/Tagout

What are the requirements for lockout/tagout and how do you insure they are properly implemented? Many serious injuries and deaths have resulted because equipment was not powered-off and tagged-out. To avoid such accidents at your company, learn how to insure that the system or machine is in a zero-energy state-and tagged. Understand why each person who operates a piece of equipment should have his or her own lock and key. The presenter will explain the different types of locks and why some pieces of equipment may require more than one lock.

Nail Gun

This "hot" subject was brought into the spotlight by several high profile accidents during 2008. This interactive session will include a demonstration on the basics of nail gun safety and proper use of this powerful piece of equipment at the construction site, in general industry and at home.

Confined Space

Does confined space always contain hazardous atmospheres? Did you know that rescuers had the highest fatality rate in confined spaces? This session teaches the supervisor requirements for permit required confined spaces; non-permit required confined spaces and who creates the permits. Learn when a monitor has to be outside the confined space and have rescue, communication and emergency services available.

Electrical Safety

Rounding out the Supervisors' Safety Shorts will be "Electrical Safety." This session focuses on the control of hazardous energy and the basic mechanisms of electrical safety. The presenter will give an overview of ground fault circuit interrupters, selecting properly insulated tools and more.

There will also be a special morning session covering the importance of the supervisor's role in keeping employees safe.
